GARY R. HARVEY

Mr. Gary R. Harvey, a member of the Defense Intelligence Senior Executive Service, is Associate Director for Intelligence, Headquarters Air Combat Command, Langley Air Force Base, VA. He assists the ACC Director of Intelligence in leading more than 2,400 intelligence operations people, and providing intelligence support to 184 active-duty and Reserve component units. He directs the development of policy, plans, doctrine, organizational concepts, weapon system requirements, and tactics, techniques and procedures applicable to ACC forces deployed worldwide.

Mr. Harvey retired from the Air Force with the rank of colonel. In his active-duty career he served in air operations on the B-52 and F/FB-111. He held staff assignments at major commands, the Air Staff, NATO and Headquarters Air Intelligence Agency. At the Air Staff and at Strategic Air Command he led operations and intelligence analysis for acquisition of advanced technology weapons and systems to include the B-2 and others now fielded. He has commanded at the squadron, group and wing levels. In NATO, he served as Chief of Intelligence for the Central Region Air Forces, and deployed as Chief of Intelligence for the Combined Air Operations Center, Vicenza, Italy. At AIA, he commanded the 67th Intelligence Wing and later served as the HQ Director of Staff. His commercial experience includes work as a strategic planning consultant for the Department of Defense. He also led the San Antonio Information Technology and Intelligence Group for a DOD contractor. Before his selection as Associate Director of ACC Intelligence, he entered civilian service as the Technical Adviser to the Director of Plans and Programs at Headquarters AIA.
